A two-step competitive process for grant applications will be required. An Expression of Interest (EOI) must first be submitted outlining the research proposal. The National Translational Research Collaborative (NTRC) will then shortlist. Selected applications will then be invited to submit a detailed application for further consideration by the NTRC.

Areas of focus:

- Research in cancer care, ideally in an outpatient setting
- Be collaborative in nature (e.g. projects should have an inter-disciplinary, inter-departmental or multi-site methodology)
- If an inter-disciplinary research group, one or more of the primary investigators must have a minimum of 1 year current membership with SHPA
- May be a 'proof-of-concept' or 'hypothesis generating' research project
- Be translational in nature; should test a practical change in clinical practice
- May lend itself to future larger research studies that assess quality of patient care outcomes

Application criteria:

- Applications for funding will not be considered if the research has commenced or concluded at the time of the grant closing date
- Applications will not be considered from previous grant recipients who have grant reports outstanding
- Research must be commenced within 12 months of notification of a successful application
- A complete list of general and mandatory conditions for grant applicants is available at the SHPA website
- Applications must be completed on the SHPA Research 'Expression of Interest' form (copies of the form are available from the National Secretariat of SHPA or the SHPA website).
