AVAILABILITY Vial contains 500 mg of doripenem as doripenem monohydrate.¹

PREPARATION Reconstitute the vial with 10 mL of water for injections or sodium chloride 0.9%.

Shake gently to form a suspension. Must be further diluted before use.¹

ADMINISTRATION

IV infusion Add 10 mL of reconstituted solution to a 100 mL bag of sodium chloride 0.9% or

glucose 5% to make a concentration of approximately 5 mg/mL. Gently shake the bag until the solution is clear. Infuse over 1 or 4 hours. Do not use glucose 5% for

infusions that are longer than 1 hour. See SPECIAL NOTES

STABILITY Vial: Store below 25 °C.

Reconstituted solution: Stable for 1 hour. 1

Diluted solution: When diluted with sodium chloride 0.9% stable for 12 hours below

25 °C and for 24 hours at 2 to 8 °C.1

When diluted with glucose 5% stable for 4 hours below 25 °C and for 24 hours at 2 to 8 °C. Glucose should not be used for infusions that are longer than 1 hour. 1
