Graham Catt resigned as CEO of the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia (PSA) today and David Quilty stepped down as Executive Director of the Pharmacy Guild of Australia (the Guild) on Friday.

Today, SHPA Chief Executive Kristin Michaels acknowledged their leadership and contributions.
