



Student Guide to Hospital Pharmacy Internships in Queensland

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Purpose of this guide

This guide has been created as an aide to support students applying for Queensland hospital pharmacy internship positions. Individuals reading this document should conduct their own research into each job application. The SHPA QLD branch takes no responsibility for updating this document or for students not receiving interviews for their job applications on the basis of this guide. Always address the selection criteria for each individual job application.

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Internships in Queensland

Queensland Health is the state's largest healthcare provider, consisting of the Department of Health and 16 separate Hospitals and Health Services—known as HHSs—which manage the State's public hospitals and public health services. Queensland has a mixed public and private healthcare system with 231 hospitals, 109 of which are private facilities that provide healthcare to Australian citizens and permanent residents.

Queensland Health delivers a range of integrated services including hospital inpatient, outpatient and emergency services, community and mental health services, aged care services and public health and health promotion programs.

Across Queensland, there are many public hospitals that offer structured training programs, such as the Intern Level Framework (ILF) for intern pharmacists to provide experience in dispensing, clinical services and drug information. These programs occur during working hours and are conducted alongside the Intern Training Program (ITP), which interns are required to complete to be eligible for registration as a pharmacist. This additional training will help you gain the competencies required to register as a pharmacist and hospital pharmacy specialist.

All intern pharmacists are expected to complete a number of hours of supervised practice set by The Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) throughout their intern year whether they complete their internship in the community, hospital or industry setting.

Queensland private hospital pharmacy departments are privately owned and operate similarly to a community pharmacy. Unlike public hospital pharmacies, they may also sell over-the-counter medications and may or may not offer a structured learning program similar to public hospitals. Each of the private hospitals may set up their own training program, and depending on the hospital you may also have the opportunity to attend QLD health training events throughout the year.

How to Apply

Applying Online via Smart Jobs:

1. All jobs advertised with Queensland Health are listed on the Queensland Government website: <https://smartjobs.qld.gov.au/>
2. Applications should be submitted online by clicking on the 'Apply Online' link at the bottom of the job advertisement.
3. You will then be able to register an account and complete the online application (this will subsequently import any saved details for further applications you wish to submit).
4. Each advertisement will include *two (or more) important documents* that applicants should read prior to applying.

*Use the *Smart Jobs job alert feature* to receive a notification time a position is advertised matching your selected criteria. This will ensure you are notified as soon as the advertisement is listed, maximising your time to update your resume and write your application*

Important Documents to Read Before Submitting an application:

5. The first document is the *information package for applicants*, developed by the local recruitment department for that hospital and health service (HHS).
6. The document contains information on the health services provided by the HHS, employment conditions, pre-employment checks and any further requirements to include in your job application.
7. The second document is the *role description*, which provides applicants with specific details about the role, key duties and accountabilities, mandatory qualifications, and any relevant information on how to apply.

Assessing Suitability for the Role:

8. Each HHS will require different documents to assess suitability for the role, so it is important to ensure you address these components in your application.
9. Examples to assess suitability may include a cover letter, selection criteria, written exercise and/ or a copy of academic results.
10. Only include what has been asked for, any additional items provided cannot be considered by the panel as this would be unfair to other candidates.

Whom to Contact for Further Information:

11. Each job listing will have the name and phone number of the *contact person* for the position.
12. This is usually the pharmacist responsible for the recruitment of this position and should be your point of contact if you would like to know more about the position, or any other questions you might have.

Selection Criteria

It is important to answer the selection criteria advertised for each position carefully and appropriately. “How you are assessed” describes the personal qualities, skills, abilities, knowledge, and qualifications required to perform a role effectively; applicants should consider **structured headings** when addressing this.

Provide evidence (1-2 specific examples) of where, and how, you have gained the required experience, skills or knowledge highlighted in the selection criteria. Examples can stem from not only the field of pharmacy but also from other personal or professional experiences. Try to think of examples that will differentiate you from other candidates.

The written application can be challenging and time intensive, however, it is important to use as much space as the application allows to articulate demonstrated capabilities and optimise your chances of being considered for the role.

The use of concise and articulate language is expected, and proofreading is a must - you don't want to miss out on an interview because of spelling mistakes! Get at least one other person to read your application, whether that be utilising a university careers service, research supervisor, lecturer or peer who can give feedback on your application.

For some roles, you must include a separate document addressing selection criteria in paragraph form in your application. A common method used to structure statements against selection criteria includes the STAR (Situation, Task, Action, Result) method.

- Situation: briefly describe the context and your role/responsibility
- Task: describe the task, project or outcome you were required to achieve
- Action: describe what you did and how you did it
- Result: what was the outcome?

Qld Private Hospitals Internships

Recruitment for private hospitals is similar to recruitment for community pharmacies, as they are privately owned. These jobs are not advertised via smart jobs but are usually advertised on job search websites such as 'Seek'. You can also use LinkedIn to alert you of some job advertisements as some hospitals may also advertise there. Also, like many community pharmacies, some jobs may not be advertised, and it is recommended that you contact the private hospital pharmacy directly about future internships or other opportunities. Relevant contacts are provided in 'About the Hospitals' section.

Benefiting from the hands-on, face-to-face, up-close and personal experience in a vast landscape, with varied regions and diverse communities, you will be challenged to go further and gain a greater depth and breadth of experience, forging strong and enduring connections with local communities and other health professionals. Pharmacists, particularly in regional settings, are an integral part of the healthcare system.

Other states and territories

In the public sector, every state and territory have different processes for recruiting. This process can change year to year and students interested in moving interstate should regularly visit the relevant health department recruitment websites for further details. It is important to note that other states and territories can advertise as early as March.

Preparing for the interview

The format of the interview traditionally follows a series of behavioural-based assessment questions and clinical question(s). You will be required to sit a formal interview with multiple assessors.

Part 1: Clinical Question - usually presented in a case study:

- Complexity varies but is multifactorial - may include 20+ issues.
 - Focus on 3-5 of your most important concerns and discuss them in order of priority.
 - You will not have time to pick up on every issue, the point of this question is to assess your baseline clinical knowledge and ability to prioritise and pick up the key issues.
- When reviewing the medications:
 - Check for allergies.
 - Ensure that the medications and dose match the condition.
 - Pathology appropriate for medications i.e., CrCl_r, LFTS etc
 - Ensure that the dosing is correct and optimised
 - Interactions with pharmacodynamic/pharmacokinetic
 - Do all the medications match evidence-based practice for the intended condition.
 - Check the dose is correct for this patient.
- Approach case holistically
 - Support at home
 - Dose administration aid required.
 - What type of education required
 - Health literacy of patients and whether are they English speaking.
 - What is an appropriate discharge plan
 - Is Warfarin/clexane bridging required?
- May be presented with a bed list, a medication chart, a discharge medication record or a prescription.
- If you have doubts/uncertainty always provide details of how you will determine the answer i.e., eTG, AMH, prescribing guidelines, team leader etc.

Part 2: Behavioural-Based Questions

Designed to assess the applicant's approach to workplace challenges that will arise.

Broadly, these questions will have a theme and within that theme, you need to demonstrate key elements that may include:

1. Attitudes and beliefs
 - Work standards
 - Positive approach

- Commitment
- Teamwork
- Customer service focus

Example question: *Tell us about a time when you were having trouble meeting deadlines.*

2. Self-motivation

- Initiative
- Innovation
- Energy
-

Example question: *Describe a problem in your work environment where you were able to solve a problem or deal with a problem in an imaginative way.*

3. Resilience, stability, and persistence

- Tenacity
- Problem-solving
- Tolerance for stress/self-awareness

Example question: *Give us an example of when you thought a process or procedure was being done poorly. What did you do? What was the effect of your actions?*

4. Maturity and judgement

- Judgement
- Attention to detail.
- Decisiveness
- Organising ability
- Communication skills

Example question: *Describe a work-related problem you have experienced and what actions you took to deal with it.*

5. Aptitude and capacity to learn.

- Ability to learn.
- Adaptability/flexibility
- Listening

Example question: *Describe a time when you had to work with unclear/unreasonable goals or uncertainty. How did you deal with the situation?*

Additional Advice:

- Describe real examples and have your best examples for behavioural-based questions prepared in SBAR format prior to the interview. (i.e., so that you do not have to spend time thinking about examples during the perusal stages).
- Do not rely on the content of your resume. During the interview, you need to communicate effectively during the interview.
- Research the hospital you are applying for. What do you know about the hospital? Do you have any questions for the interviewers?

Tips from Previous Hospital Interns

Jake Kleinschmidt, Gold Coast University Hospital & Robina Hospital 2021 intern:

Use your interview preparation time (if any) wisely. Don't waste time trying to perfect the response to a question until you have at least jotted down a few points for all the other questions first.

Paeton Karakitsos, Gold Coast University Hospital & Robina Hospital 2022 intern:

Write responses for various interview questions, but practice these with family or friends. Have them throw questions at you that you were not expecting - this will develop your ability to think on your feet and identify gaps in your application.

Aislinn Kennedy, Royal Brisbane & Women's Hospital 2020 intern:

If you really want to work in a hospital, consider places outside Brisbane and private hospitals too- there are so many hospitals throughout Queensland that take interns you just need to apply!

Madeline Bullock, Princess Alexandra Hospital 2022 intern:

When you're preparing an application/getting ready for an interview with a hospital; I would highly recommend taking some time to research the hospital's core values and/or strategic vision and think about examples of where you have demonstrated these values either professionally or personally. This shows that you have taken the time to consider why you would be a good fit for the hospital as a whole and shows that you are willing to go above and beyond for the role. Also, in interviews don't be afraid to speak out loud your thought process as it is not always the most important thing to get the 'right answer' straight away. Remember knowledge can always be taught during intern year; how problem solve and approach a clinical situation is of more interest to the interview panel. Finally, if you are asked a question and can't think of an answer straight away take the time to pause and think – a cool trick I was taught by another pharmacist is to take a measured sip of water and use that time to pause and collect your thoughts.

Aimee Wang, Princess Alexandra Hospital 2022 intern:

To preference placements based on where you would like to work. When at the placement take every opportunity to learn and get to know those around you.

Harriet Thomasson, Rockhampton Hospital 2022 intern:

If applying regionally and rurally, do a bit of research on the area where the hospital is based and the surrounding health services/ facilities that are attached and base some of your questions at the end of the interview around this. It will show that you are interested in not only the job but the area as a whole. When interviewing remember that the panel does not expect you to know everything, if you aren't sure of an answer just talk through what your process would be to address the issue (resources etc). Finally, have examples for each of your questions- if you say you have great teamwork skills, make sure to give an example.

Beth Clark, Ipswich Hospital 2022 intern:

Write down examples of situations you have dealt with at work as they happen and keep them in a document or note. These can be times you dealt with conflict, had to prioritise tasks, when you worked well in a team or educated a patient. This way you have examples ready to go when you are interview prepping, rather than trying to remember back to situations and the details. I still do this even now! You can do this for any job you are currently in, whether it be pharmacy, hospitality or customer service.

Next Steps: What happens if you're unsuccessful with a hospital intern position?

Don't be disheartened that you did not get your dream job in a hospital pharmacy. There are many very rewarding careers to be had in pharmacy that are not based in a hospital. But if clinical hospital pharmacy is still where you want to go, there are ways to help open that door.

- Ask for feedback from the application process AND **reflect** on the feedback!
 - How can you improve your chances next time?
- Work in a variety of practice areas
 - Learning different skills like CPAP, vaccinations, compounding, pharmacist prescribing (TBC), addiction clinic pharmacies, outpatient hospital pharmacies, oncology compounding, management roles, etc.
 - Make your experiences stand out from the crowd!
- Complete additional CPD / training in clinical pharmacy
 - If you have the basic training already, it will be easier to transition.
 - E.g., SHPA Introduction to Hospital Pharmacy.
- Get involved in activities outside of work.
 - Hiring managers like to see that you do more than just work, you need to live your life too!
 - These other experiences can also show evidence of transferable skills such as teamwork, managing teams, project management, etc.
- Get help with resume and cover letter writing.
 - Get advice from friends and family and find resume writing tips.
 - Make sure you are writing to reflect the job you are applying for.
- Consider further studies in pharmacy.
 - Not essential but may help you stand out from the crowd.
- Research the hospital you are applying for.
 - Understand their ethos, read through the entire application process and documents, and consider how your experiences will make you the perfect fit.
- Go rural!
 - There are plenty of hospitals in rural areas that are in need of pharmacists.
- Check out the SHPA jobs board
- Networking

SHPA Residency Programs

The SHPA hospital pharmacy residency programs are a new initiative that aims to establish structured, formalised, supported, and accredited programs for newly practising hospital pharmacists in their foundation years or those seeking specialised practice.
