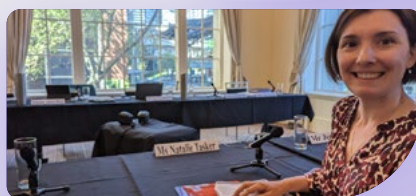

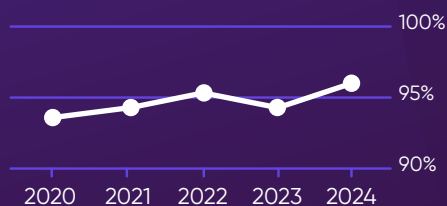
This year saw the completion of the *Transformation 2024* agenda, culminating in the rebranding of our organisation under the new trading name Advanced Pharmacy Australia (AdPha) in August.

The evolution toward a more inclusive identity aligns with our purpose, unchanged in spirit since the turn of the century, to 'improve health outcomes from medicines use within hospitals and/or other healthcare facilities or settings (including the home) where pharmacists, the membership and other health professionals practise, through the use of pharmacist expertise in medicines management.'

At Medicines Management 2023 held in Cairns, marking the return of Australia's largest scientific pharmacy conference to regional Australia, President Tom Simpson encapsulated the spirit of this evolution.

*'Our history will always be in the hospital setting; but the positive impact of our expertise can, and should, transcend traditional care boundaries. We will continue to work to break down silos, supporting and recognising practitioners based on what they can do — not where they work.'*

# CONNECTION THROUGH COMMUNITIES

This year saw the long-awaited migration to a custom-built online platform for Specialty Practice, when Communities was launched in July (see pg 6).

Specialty Practice prospered this year as AdPha's main 'marketplace' of member expertise. The average Specialty Practice Group now counts 664 members, and the most recent is Climate + Health, added on World Pharmacists Day in September.

# ADVANCING PHARMACY EDUCATION

Propelled by member expertise, AdPha CPD continued to grow as a thriving hub of pharmacy knowledge in 2023-24.

Australia's pre-eminent pharmacy education program saw recorded attendance of 7,347 across 75 national events, an increase of 33%.

Our Branches continued to meet member needs via virtual and local in-person events, with a total of 35 events attended by 2,274 delegates, an increase of 25% on 2022-23.

# DELIVERING OUR MISSION

This has been a monumental year for our organisation.

Significant investments in members were realised under the Transformation agenda (pgs 5-6), which comprised three pillars: recognition, specialisation and identity.

Highlights include the successful launch of the Australian and New Zealand College of Advanced Pharmacy (ANZCAP), with postnominals now boasted by 2,500 pharmacists and technicians from around the country; the new custom-built Communities platform for member networking and our 33 Specialty Practice Groups; and the continuation of our leadership in recognising and uplifting technicians as crucial members of hospital pharmacy teams.

There were many other milestones. Last November, Medicines Management 2023 in Cairns saw the largest scientific pharmacy conference return to regional Australia for the first time in a decade, attracting over 900 attendees.

We welcomed our first New Zealanders to our community through Affiliate Membership in partnership with the New Zealand Hospital Pharmacy Association (NZHPA).

And the comprehensive update of our Clinical Pharmacy Standards approached release. First published in 1996, this blueprint for the profession has been fully reviewed and restructured to reflect contemporary practice, and will be a highlight of Medicines Management 2024, which returns to Adelaide this spring.

The transformative 2023-24 year ended with the Board of Directors leading the implementation of a new brand and trading name for our venerable organisation, as Advanced Pharmacy Australia.

On behalf of the Board, I welcome all the feedback and the continuing conversations that have been sparked by the evolution of our identity.

How we represent current and prospective members, and how we explain the current and future impact of hospital pharmacy, is key to strengthening our advocacy, delivering against our mission and expanding opportunities for our profession.

Through our new branding we signal where hospital pharmacy is going, rather than reflecting what it has been. A driving force of hospital-informed change that is increasingly delivered in diverse care settings.

This is what you, AdPha members, continued to do: work, innovate and deliver safer and more effective care to Australians, at their most unwell, in and around our hospitals.

You continued to share your knowledge with fellow members, your peers and interdisciplinary colleagues.

We have many knowledge hubs, and each is thriving. Four Specialty Practice Groups now count 1,000+ members (pg 3) and AdPha CPD reached 7,347 participants (pg 3) across all levels of practice. We also acknowledge and celebrate our leaders, and I congratulate again the winners of our 2023 awards (pg 8), as well as the 2,500 practitioners recognised through ANZCAP (pg 5).

Bringing this all together, our 2024 Honour Roll totals 377 members (pgs 9-11), each having lended their time and expertise to advance Australian pharmacy and patient care over the past year through key AdPha bodies, committees and groups steering key programs, projects and events across advocacy, education, workforce development and the national conference.

Along with every member, current and future, you embody advanced pharmacy. Hospital-led but not hospital-centric; advanced due to the strength of the care team that wraps around each patient, not because of the skills or experience of each individual practitioner.

I thank each and every one of you for your contributions, and look forward to what we can next achieve to grow and uplift our practice and profession.

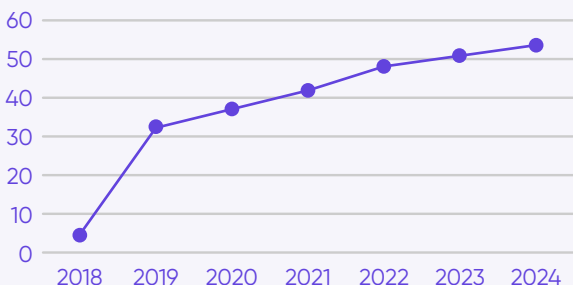
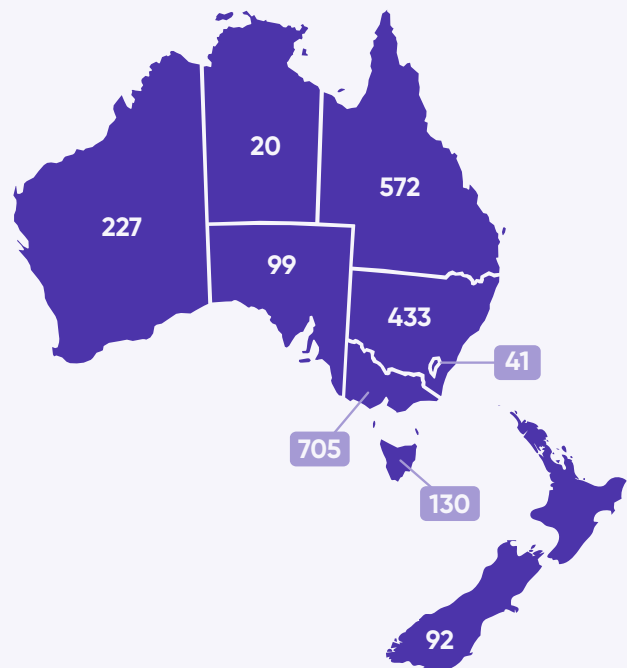

More than 2,500 member and non-member pharmacists and technicians are now recognised through the programs of the **Australian and New Zealand College of Advanced Pharmacy (ANZCAP)**, which was established in October 2023 (right).

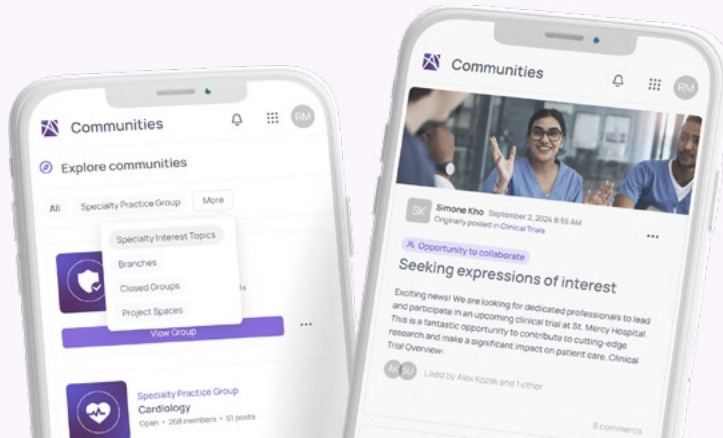
Early this year, Pharmacist Resident and Pharmacist Registrar Training Programs, formerly known as SHPA Residencies, were migrated to the new ANZCAP digital platform, facilitating easier management of portfolios and recognitions and better communication between participants, preceptors and AdPha support. There are now 54 hospitals and primary care settings accredited as training sites (below).



**AdPha CPD**, Australia's pre-eminent pharmacy education program, continued to grow this year while evolving in format, guided by member preferences (see figures pg 2).

Foundation-level education became entirely self-paced through online modules, ensuring pharmacists can instantly undertake this key learning upon starting or commencing a speciality rotation or moving into an area of practice.

✓ **Communities** launched in July 2024. The customised platform, supported with iOS and Android apps, enables members to share single posts across multiple Specialty Practice Groups (SPGs), of which there are now 33, including four with membership over 1,000.



✓ A key focus of members and hospital pharmacy more broadly is advancing collaborative care across settings. We continue to support initiatives such as **Partnered Pharmacist Medication Prescribing (PPMP)**, with National PPMC Credentialling launched in late 2023.

✓ The landmark **Standard of Practice in Clinical Pharmacy Services** has guided Australian practice for decades. The comprehensive 2023-24 revision and update is nearly complete – led by the 11-member Editorial Committee and shaped by input from more than 100 members and from external organisations – reflecting contemporary and emerging practices that complete the patient journey in and out of hospital. The **Advanced Pharmacy Australia Clinical Pharmacy Standards** will be released in November.

✓ In its second year, **MedsAware: Deprescribing Action Week** social media engagement grew by 30%, generated extensive media coverage and received widespread support from pharmacy, health and medical industries as well as government. The 2024 theme 'Ask because you care' targeted inappropriate use of psychotropics in aged and disability care.

✓ Informed by member and non-member market research and led by the Board, the new branding and trading name **Advanced Pharmacy Australia (AdPha)** was launched in August, marking an important statement of progression and inclusion. In May 2024, members voted to add a Pharmacy Technician position to the Board of Directors.

Membership figures remained strong, reaching 5,700 by 1 July 2024, the highest figure in our organisation's history. For the first time, this includes Affiliate Members from New Zealand through our Memorandum of Understanding with the **New Zealand Hospital Pharmacy Association (NZHPA)**, which was signed in September 2023.



# AMPLIFYING YOUR VOICE

Following an AdPha-guided visit by Health Minister Mark Butler last year, the Partnered Pharmacist Medication Prescribing (PPMP) program at the Lyell McEwin Hospital in South Australia was nominated for an SA Health Premier's Award, an exemplary demonstration of the potential of pharmacist-led innovations to improve medication safety and service efficiency. In Queensland, AdPha represented hospital pharmacy on the QPPMP working group that made great progress; we look forward to supporting statewide implementation in 2025.

The fourth edition of *Pharmacy Forecast Australia*, the first released under Advanced Pharmacy Australia branding, also explored pharmacists prescribing, in addition to digital innovation and pharmacist-led multidisciplinary initiatives as the profession shapes practice beyond hospital walls. The launch at Parliament House in Canberra saw authors and AdPha members engage with parliamentarians and leaders from key stakeholders and partner organisations.

Years of AdPha advocacy for Pharmaceutical Reform Agreements (PRAs) in NSW and ACT, to extend access to PBS-listed medicines upon leaving hospital, continue to gain traction, supported this year by the mid-term review of the National Health Reform Agreement (NHRA) and the PRA Review Report.

In a big advocacy win, the Closing the Gap (CTG) PBS co-payment was expanded, including \$100 medicines from July 2024, and will extend to public hospital pharmacies from January 2025. AdPha has advocated for this expansion for many years to ensure safer and more equitable medicines access for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander populations.

Other engagement with government included AdPha playing a key role in Scope of Practice Review workshops and Emma McBride MP, Assistant Minister for Mental Health and Suicide Prevention and Assistant Minister Rural and Regional Health, opened MM2023 in Cairns.

# RAISING AWARENESS

The *Journal of Pharmacy Practice and Research* (JPPR)'s reputation and impact continues to grow with a significant increase in submissions, +36% year-on-year.

Positive broadcast media coverage of AdPha's activities reached a cumulative audience of 80.4 million in 2023-24, double the total of 2022-23, driven by increasing advocacy activity and MedsAware: Deprescribing Action Week.

The theme for the 2024 MedsAware campaign was 'Ask because you care', focused on empowering older Australians, Australians living with a disability, and their carers, to ask health professionals: 'Could any of these medicines be doing more harm than good?'
