Elected President of SHPA in 2018, Mr Fowler is a former Treasurer and Chair of the Workforce Transformation Committee and currently practices as specialist Critical Care Pharmacist in the Launceston General Hospital Intensive Care Unit.

SHPA Tasmanian Branch Chair Michelle Paine says Mr Fowler's commitment to the profession is evident in his focus on future pharmacy leaders.
